The Bible teaches that **Messiah** would be **Fully God** & also **Fully Man**, but it also teaches that **Messiah** had to be eligible & able to hold three offices **Prophet - Priest – King**. Why?

A **Prophet** has to represent God to the people – speak God's message to the people.

A **Priest** has to represent the people to God – make sacrifices on their behalf.

A **King** must rule God's people with Righteousness, Peace & Joy.

The first prophet mentioned in the bible is Abraham (Gen 20:7), but the person whose life & ministry is given as a minimum standard for the Messiah is Moses. This is found in Deut. 18:15-18.



Although many prophets followed Moses and may have had some similarities to his life & ministry, in Ex 34:10 it records that "**No prophet had arisen like Moses whom the Lord knew face to face**".

It appears this postscript was added to the Torah much later, some think by Joshua or after the exile of Babylon & some even at the closing of the Old Testament, but it's really uncertain. Certainly, many apocryphal writings were still looking for the Messiah who would fulfil this passage.

When the rulers ask John the Baptist "Are you the Prophet" he answered "No" John 1:19-23

The people testified concerning Jesus

At the feeding of the 5,000 - John 6:14, the people said "This is truly the prophet who is to come"

At the feast of tabernacles - John 7:40, the people said "Truly this is the prophet"

When Jesus made his final & triumphal entry into Jerusalem – Matt 21:11, the people gave him a king's welcome & said "**This is** <u>Jesus, the prophet</u> from Nazareth of Galilee"

Peter testified to all the people at the temple concerning Jesus

Quoting Duet. 18:15-18, and then all the prophets he concluded that *Jesus was The Prophet*, God promised by stating **"To you first God having raised up His Servant Jesus, sent him to bless you, in turning away every one of you from your iniquities**" Acts 3:22-26

Jesus himself emphasised the fact that "He only spoke God's words"

John 7:16 "My doctrine is not Mine, but His who sent Me"

John 8:26 "I speak to the world those things which I heard from Him"

John 8:28 "as My Father taught Me, I speak these things"

Similar statements are made in John 12:49-50; 14:10 & 17:8


